
Objectives

 - 14 pinouts, 4 amp.
 - Only use one of them. E.g. amp1, including pin 1, 2, 3 plus pin 4, 11(V+ and GND)
- The sign




4 experiments


- Inverting amplifier

- Voltage follower


Follow the procedures listed on the lab report

Suggestion

- Start from V+ and GND, connect them to the power supply through power trails
- 3 pins of an Amp
- Resistors and Dupont wires
- Input and output to oscilloscope
- Check the circuit and connectivity
- Supply the power
- Record the waveforms
