CSCI5550 Advanced File and Storage Systems

Research Proposal Specification (2019/20)

■ Objectives:

- Study on a state-of-the-art research topic in file and storage systems
- Write a research article to propose how to further improve the stateof-the-art research

■ Requirements:

- It is a **group-based** assignment: The grouping should be the same as that of *survey presentations*.
- The main topic **must** be relevant to one of the *survey presentations* delivered (by either your own group or other groups) in this course.
- The article **must** cover, <u>but not limited to</u>, the following points:
 - Proposal Title: Entitle an informative, but short and concise for your research proposal.
 - O **Declarations**: State clearly (1) whether this research proposal overlaps to your MPhil or PhD studies, and (2) which survey presentation this research proposal is relevant to.
 - o **Introduction**: Outline the key issues and problems being addressed by your research proposal.
 - O **Background**: Describe previous or alternative approaches to the research problem and criticize their strengths and deficiencies. You **must** elaborate at least three previous studies which are relevant to your research proposal.
 - Methodology: Elaborate your useful observations/insights or suggestions/approaches that could substantially improve the state-of-the-art research. Appropriate preliminary experiments and tests can be optionally provided.
 - Division of Labor: Brief the contributions/workloads made by the group member(s) individually. (Note: We may grade individually for each group member.)
 - **References**: Cite the relevant studies properly.

- The article **should not** exceed (<u>6 pages</u> for *one-person groups*, <u>8</u> <u>pages</u> for *two-people groups*), <u>excluding references</u>, using 10-point size font on 8.5x11 inch pages (US letter format, a more widely accepted format than A4 for paper submissions).
- The format should be in IEEE conference style (single-spaced and double-column). You can use the style templates for Latex or Microsoft Word, which you can download from: https://www.ieee.org/conferences/publishing/templates.html
- You are suggested to use figures or tables to illustratively present your ideas and approaches.
- You are suggested to write the article in a tutorial style, in the sense that it is comprehensible to non-specialist general readers.

■ Grading (100%)

- Technical depth of your criticism on previous/relevant studies (40%)
- New technical insights or approaches (40%)
- Quality of presentation/writing (20%)
